**Minutes
Mead Public Library
Board of Trustees
November 19, 2015**

A meeting of the Mead Public Library (MPL) Board of Trustees was held on Thursday, November 19 in The Loft. Present Board of Trustee members were Maeve Quinn, presiding, Chris Campe, Dave Hoffman, Dolcye Johnson, Nancy Mannchen, Henry Nelson, and Dirk Zylman. Unable to attend was Kathie Norman. Staff members present: Debbie DeAmico, Garrett Erickson, Diane Kallas, Pat Mueller, and Melissa Prentice.

1. Opening of Meeting

- 1.1 Quinn called the meeting for order at 3:47 p.m. She determined there was a quorum present.
- 1.2 Quinn led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 1.3 There were no public comments at this meeting.
- 1.4 Nelson **moved** to approve the minutes from October 22, 2015; Campe **seconded** the motion. The motion **passed**.

1.5 Correspondence, Announcements, and Common Council Reports

Quinn said she spoke with Mayor Vandersteen regarding the library Board's two vacancies. The Mayor indicated he has initiated the appointment of an Alderperson as liaison, and he is seeking someone to volunteer to serve on the MPL Board of Trustees.

Zylman recommended changing the Board of Trustees Bylaws to appoint an alderperson annually.

Quinn complimented Pat Mueller on her job performance at the library. Mueller is retiring as administrative assistant/volunteer coordinator effective December 1. The Board presented her with a bouquet of flowers.

Quinn reminded members that the December meeting will include a social at 3:30 p.m. in The Loft.

2. Committee Reports

2.1 Finance Committee – Dirk Zylman, Chair

Zylman reported the Finance Committee discussed the following:

- Metrics under budget for payroll by \$84,000
- MPL received \$153,505 from the Laverne Carter estate
- Reviewed budget status report

- Developing priority list for 2016
- Discussed reserves as targeted for general operations
- 850 funds have recovered from previous month's report

Johnson **moved** and Mannchen **seconded** to accept on behalf of MPL the Carter donation as restricted for capital expenses improvements. The motion **passed.**

2.2 Review and approve payment of expenditures, including payroll; receive monthly 2015 budget status report to date; report of gifts received

Zylman **moved** to approve payment of expenditures including payroll and reoccurring expenses. Nelson **seconded** the motion. The motion **carried.**

3. Items for discussion and possible action

3.1 Update "Finance" policy

Erickson reviewed WI state statutes that dictates library invoices need Board approval before paying monthly bills. He explained the current process is often making us late with payments and incurred unnecessary penalties and fees. The City Atty. Chuck Adams assisted with drafting a revised policy for the Board of Trustees. The proposed "Finance" policy was reviewed
Zylman **moved** to accept the revised "Finance" policy as presented. Hoffman **seconded** the motion. The motion **carried.**

3.2 Update Board of Trustees Bylaws document

The change to the Bylaws document was "debts paid during the current period" which will allow for timely compliance to pay MPL invoices.
Zylman **moved** and Nelson **seconded** approval of the Board of Trustees Bylaws as presented. The motion **passed.**

3.3 Transfer Laverne Carter estate donation to MPL Foundation for investment purposes

Finance Committee members recommended and Nelson **moved** transferring the funds to MPL Foundation to invest until disbursement of the restricted donation. Johnson **seconded** the motion. The motion **passed.**

3.4 Create library reserve fund for sick-leave obligation

Erickson discussed a contract to transfer funds from the City of Sheboygan to MPL's sick-leave reserve fund. Members reviewed a Resolution for possible approval.

Nelson **moved** for a Resolution to authorize the City of Sheboygan Finance Department to transfer \$119,546.00 for payment of Mead Public Library (MPL) employee accrued sick-leave benefit payments from the City of Sheboygan's General Fund to a "MPL Sick-Leave Reserve Account" fund as per the City of Sheboygan's "Res. No. 15-16 Termination Agreement" terminating the January

28, 2010 agreement, and setup a MPL reserve account for future accrued employee sick-leave obligation payouts. Zylman **seconded** the motion. The motion **passed**.

Nelson **moved** for a Resolution to authorize Mead Public Library (MPL) Business Manager and City of Sheboygan Finance Department, after an audit by MPL Business Manager, and based on availability of funds at fiscal year-end being December 31, 2015 to transfer the difference between MPL's total monetary sick-leave payout obligation less the \$119,546.00 transferred by the City of Sheboygan to the newly created "Sick-Leave Reserve Fund" to meet the total obligation by MPL to eligible employees covered under the sick-leave benefit. To authorize MPL Business Manager to audit the employee accrued sick-leave obligation reserve fund on an annual basis as of the fiscal year-end being December 31st of each year, and adjust the reserve account to maintain the actual total monetary obligation payable to MPL eligible employees under the sick-leave accrued benefit. Excessive funds in the "Sick Leave Reserve" fund after fiscal year-end audit will be transferred to MPL's general reserve account, or if the fund does not meet the monetary obligations at fiscal year-end then based on availability of funds at fiscal year-end the shortfall of funds will be transferred to the "Sick-Leave Reserve" fund to meet the total sick-leave liability obligation. Johnson **seconded** the motion. The motion **passed**.

3.5 Discussion and possible action to close library on Friday, 2-12-16 for staff in-service

Hoffman **moved** and Mannchen **seconded** a motion to close the library on 2-12-16 for a staff in-service day.

4. Director's Report – Garrett Erickson

4.1 Update on first and second floor modifications

- Torke coffee vending machine has been added on First Floor
 - After weeding our reference collections the Quiet Study is now more visible
 - Magazines and newspapers have been moved; improved lighting added
 - Developing a Maker Space which is a concept of creations by patrons
 - Computers in teen area on Second Floor will be shifted to help lower noise levels
 - Plans to move the Reference desk to the center of the library
 - Signage and library maps will be updated
- Quinn recommended signage acknowledge MPL Foundation funding be incorporated.

4.2 Position openings update

Chase DeVrou, Information Technology Specialist, will start December 1
Lauren Richmond, Administrative Assistant/Volunteer Coordinator, will start November 30

4.3 Update of programming

Prentice reviewed programs offered at MPL:

- Art 4 Fun had record attendance (61)
- Make a Yuletide cake (20)
- Planning started for Summer 2016 Library program
- Sheboygan Connects 2016 is being planned
- Star Wars event (400)

In response to a question by Johnson regarding low program attendance Prentice responded that since September a committee to review programs has been developed to plan events and programs for increased attendance.

4.4 October statistics

Erickson indicated that there are national statistics that indicate library staff weeding collections increases circulation because materials are easier to find by patrons. Our CD music is now in open cases and relabeled to make it easier to locate music artists.

Erickson encouraged Board of Trustee members to let him know of items or trends they would like to discuss for monthly review.

5. Liaison Reports

5.1 Eastern Shores Library System (ESLS) – Henry Nelson

Bookmobile bid needs to be approved. Michael Swendrowski from Specialty Vehicle Services attended the Contracts Committee meeting, and he reviewed the three bid proposals. The Contracts Committee will recommend one of the proposals to the Budget Committee and then to the full ESLS Board.

New ESLS delivery truck is on the road.

Nelson referenced a newspaper article that ESLS wants to add Board members.

Mid-Wisconsin Federated Library System Merger Study Committee met with the ESLS staff, board members, and librarians on Wednesday, November 11 at ESLS. ESLS Director Amy Birtell was sent a list of questions for potential system merger partners. The committee reviewed the questions during the meeting. Prentice attended the meeting and reviewed her impressions of positive feedback for the next System Merger Study Committee meeting. Nelson read an email communication from Birtell regarding the meeting.

The next ESLS Board meeting is Monday, November 23 at 4:30 p.m. at the Oostburg Library.

- Approved \$1,000 donation for Facebook and Footnotes e-newsletter

Hoffman announced a Sheboygan Squared meeting will be held at MPL on December 8 to discuss possible uses of empty space in the downtown area to make it more inviting. Plans for the City's water feature enhancements were shared. Hoffman asked if it possible to extend MPL's Wi-Fi out to 8th Street.

Quinn said the City Building Use Committee still has not scheduled a meeting; MPL Board of Trustees will be notified to consider attending this important meeting.

Quinn encouraged voting online for the Levitt Amp summer concerts series. Voting can be accomplished on the library website homepage.

Dear Eastern Shores Library System,

Thank you for sharing information and meeting with the Mid-Wisconsin Federated Library System as we explored potential system merger partners. One of the things the MWFLS Merger Study Committee heard in their visits to your headquarters and that of Arrowhead Library System is that the system member libraries haven't had the opportunity to fully discuss what they think about a potential merger with MWFLS. Before making a final determination of which system MWFLS would like to talk formally with regarding a potential merger, we would like to provide ESLS with the opportunity to discuss this possibility further internally and determine if your system and member libraries see MWFLS as a viable and compatible potential merger partner.

The MWFLS Merger Study Committee and member libraries in Dodge and Washington counties discussed some starting points they would like to be considered as possible negotiation parameters during a merger discussion with either ALS or ESLS. The MWFLS libraries feel they've identified a set of negotiating parameters that would make a merger with another system feasible for each MWFLS library. The MWFLS board requests a written response from ESLS by January 22, 2016 informing the MWFLS board that both the ESLS board and all of the member libraries have had an opportunity to discuss a potential merger with MWFLS and, if agreed, that they are acceptable to negotiating with MWFLS within the following parameters.

1. Discussion and negotiation regarding system service costs shared by libraries for ILS, delivery and other services will be handled so any fee changes do not result in any increases that would prohibit MWFLS libraries participation in the service. Specifically for the smaller libraries in MWFLS this means keeping overall fees near what they currently are in MWFLS.
2. The governance model developed for the merged system would be one that first seeks finding consensus among libraries. The model would include some level of weighted voting for budget related decisions, but would include one vote per library for not-budget decision items.
3. The creation of a merged system would include a plan for developing a migration plan to a new generation ILS.
4. Members of the merged system participating in the shared ILS would be open to discussing circulation standards.
5. A system plan will be developed for the system to be a leader for libraries in non-ILS technology and innovation along with providing the technology support the libraries need to provide cutting edge service to their patrons.
6. A delivery service model could be discussed that would allow for some members to receive less than 5-day per week delivery service if desired, but allow those that want 5-day delivery to maintain that level of service.
7. The merged system would seek the best qualified candidates to fill the staff positions as identified and needed to fulfill the service priorities of the merged system.

Upon hearing from both ALS and ESLS, the MWFLS board will make a final determination of which system it will request to engage in formal merger negotiation discussions.

Circulation Committee: Martha, Carmin, Cathy, Betty, David, Diane, Trix

PowerPoint presentation the SLAC reviewed -

- Statement 1 and Statement 2 were reviewed by the Formula and Governance Committee

Statement 1: Two formulas presented: #1 David Nimmer formula, #2 Amy and Todd formula. The two formulas were reviewed. Jen moved to send both scenarios on to MWFLS. Linda B seconded, motion carried by voice vote.

Statement 2: Voting Strategies: Garrett moved to send the statement "Weighted voting for all". Martha seconded the motion, motion carried by voice vote.

- Statements 3, 4, and 6 were reviewed by the Circulation Committee

Statement 3: Eastern Shores Library System libraries pay each year into an account for a new generation ILS. At this time, ESLS is not pursuing a new ILS, especially in light of the proposed short time frame to merge systems. Innovative owns Polaris and is working to advance the ILS. David moved to approve the statement, seconded by Betty. Motion carried by voice vote.

Statement 4: Eastern Shores Library System is open to discussing circulation standards. ESLS has guidelines and standards and also allows for local flexibility. We allow Lucky Day collections. The Circulation Committee meets on a regular basis to discuss issues. These issues are brought to the Shared Library Automation Committee meeting as recommendations. Recommendations are agreed through a consensus or a vote, if needed. Sue moved to approve the statement, seconded by Mark. Motion carried by voice vote.

Statement 6: Delivery is a basic service and is included in the amount each library pays in the formulas in Statement 1. Each library receives five day delivery regardless of size and location. After an initial period, we would be open to discussing options. David moved to approve the statement, seconded by Linda B. Motion carried by voice vote.

Statements 5 and 7 were reviewed by ESLS staff:

Statement 5: Eastern Shores Library System is excited to be working with Bruce Smith, WiLS consultant, on strategic planning beginning in early 2016. ESLS will welcome a strategic planning process with Washington and Dodge once a commitment is made. Linda P moved to approve the statement, seconded by Betty. Motion carried by voice vote.

Statement #7: Definitely, our services are only as good as the people leading them. The planned strategic planning will aid in identifying what staff and skill set the staff need in order to move the new system forward. Erin moved to approve the statement, seconded by Nicole. Motion carried by voice vote.

Discussion and response to the last paragraph statement on the MWFLS letter:

The libraries of Eastern Shores are willing to keep channels open and discuss options further with Mid-Wisconsin Federated Library System. Martha moved to approve the statement, seconded by David. Motion carried by voice vote.
