BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS:

In 2015, the Sheboygan skatepark was removed because the features could no longer be properly maintained. The City hired Stantec Consulting in fall 2015 to design a new skatepark. Since then Stantec has held three community design meetings and has worked with the City and EOS, a local skate and surf business, to reach out to the community by social media.

In 2016, a final skatepark design was completed. Using several different consultant sources, the city staff recommended a \$442,588 budget for the skatepark project which was approved by the Common Council for construction in 2017.

STAFF COMMENTS:

The identified 2017 revenue sources to pay for the \$442,588 cost included:

- \$176,375 in anticipated donations. (To date, \$10,000 has been donated.)
- \$35,000 in Capital Project Fund assigned fund balance
- \$231,213 of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds.

It is anticipated that construction bid documents would be sent out late February, construction of the park would be over the summer and grand opening would be fall of this year, 2017.

In an effort to invite community ownership and offset budgeted money for construction of the Sheboygan skatepark, I would like to discuss with the Marina, Parks and Forestry Commission a fundraising effort for the naming and sponsoring of the skatepark and the different features. Attached is a list of fundraising items and costs for discussion.

BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS:

Attached is the current Municipal Code, Sec. 18-15, Pets prohibited in parks and public grounds. Sec. 18-15, (c) on-leash areas; state that dogs are allowed on North Point Park, north of the northern most Jetty. For discussion purposes I would like to consider allowing leashed dogs starting at the third Jetty from North Point Park.

STAFF COMMENTS:

I am recommending this discussion for two reasons. The first is to provide a beach that is dog friendly on the north side of the city. At this time if the public wanted to enjoy a walk along the beach with their dog, they would need to travel to the south side, where they can do so at Lakeview Park. The second reason would be to help educate the public that dogs are not allowed on Deland Beach by providing an area where they can be.

This area is away from the main beach and dogs would still need to be leashed.

Discussion of Municipal Code: Sec. 18-15 and possible changing with resolution.

Sec. 18-15. - Pets prohibited in parks and on public grounds except in designated areas; regulations.

- (a) Pets are prohibited in all city parks, beaches or other public grounds, except in areas designated by the common council and posted by the superintendent of parks as either off-leash or on-leash areas, or in areas designated by the common council for the training or showing of pets.
- (b) Designated off-leash areas.
 - (1) Unleashed pets shall be allowed at the following locations provided that they are at all times under immediate control, such as by voice command of the owner or other person physically capable of restraining the pet:
 - a. Lakeview Park Beach area delineated by the superintendent of parks with snow fencing;
 - b. City-owned property east of Lakeshore Road (County LS) north of the Pigeon River, within the Pigeon River Environmental Corridor.
- (c) On-leash areas.
 - (1) Pets shall be allowed at the following locations: provided they are restrained by a substantial leash or chain not exceeding eight feet in length, or a retractable leash not exceeding 15 feet in length in the hands of a person directly controlling the movement of the animal:
 - a. Lakeview Park;
 - b. North Point Park, north of the northernmost jetty;
 - c. North Point overlook;
 - d. The city's urban recreational trail which extends through and connects portions of Taylor Park, Kiwanis Park, Workers Water Street Park, Rotary Riverview Park, Deland Park lakefront, North Point Park, North Point overlook, and Vollrath Park;
 - e. City-owned Green Wing Drive retention ponds;
 - f. The city-owned green space area adjacent to Fisherman's Creek on the south side of Camelot Boulevard between 1211 and 1411 Camelot Boulevard.
- (d) Any person owning or having charge, custody, care or control of a pet who shall permit the pet to be present in any of the prohibited areas or in any of the designated areas in violation of the provisions of this section shall be subject to penalty as provided in section 18-3.
- (e)

Any person owning or having charge, custody, care or control of a pet in a designated off-leash or on-leash area who fails to clean up the pet's feces shall be subject to a forfeiture of \$125.00, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment thereof, imprisonment in the county jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid, but not to exceed 30 days.

(f) The superintendent of parks shall post areas designated as off-leash and on-leash areas where pets are allowed, shall post the forfeiture amount for violations for subsection (e) above, and shall supply waste receptacles and waste bags for the public's use in complying with the requirements of subsection (e) above.

(g) This section shall not apply to police dogs.
