Could you add this to the agenda for tonight's common council meeting to be referred to Public Works/ Thank you.

I received a phone call from Betsy Metscher (921 North 25th Street) asking for a street light to be installed in the block on 25th Street between Erie and Ontario Avenues. She stated that the only street light in the area is north of Ontario Avenue and it does not give off much light because of the leaves on the trees around it. She said that, some of the residents do not feel safe because it is so dark and they cannot see if anyone is hiding in the area at night. It is also difficult to see if there is anything to cause them to trip on the sidewalk and some people walk over to Pick & Save which is about two blocks away. To try to get more light in the area at night, many people leave their porch lights on at night.

I checked that block out on Sunday evening, October 2 and it is indeed very dark. If a child ran out into the street, that child would probably not be seen until it was too late because of how dark it is.

I am writing in regards to the 1 Hour parking signs on my street. There is limited parking on my street, and there is a 1-hour parking sign near my home that was intended for the former, The Book Store, and it was intended for the three parking spots in front of The Book Store. There are also two signs near 10th and Lincoln which are also confusing, they are placed very close to each other, with one sign having two arrows for 1-hour parking and the other with an arrow pointing in one direction saying 1-hour parking from here to corner. 

Dear Alderpersons,

I have written to you in the past regarding the intersection of 12th Street and North Avenue in the past. I feel it is necessary to do so again.

I live at this intersection at 1203 North Ave. so I have a front row seat to what I believe could possibly be the most dangerous intersection in the City of Sheboygan. I believe this for the following reasons:

Stop signs were installed to make the intersection a four way stop. Even with the addition of blinking red lights the driving public either doesn't notice the signs or ignores them a great deal of the time. Without exaggeration, I would estimate that half of the stops at this intersection are rolling stops at best. At worst people drive right through them on the North Avenue without slowing down at all.

This neighborhood has turned over in the past few years and there are a lot of kids playing in and around this intersection. In addition, hundreds of kids pass through this area every school day twice a day.

Having lived here when there was no stop sign it seems to me that kids were more aware of oncoming traffic, and, if they needed to, could go to 13th Street and cross at the four way stop. I feel that the kids have a false sense of security now crossing this intersection. I was told that last week a child did get hit by a car either there or nearby.

Having to stop so many times on this boulevard most times of the day it sounds like a drag racing strip with cars squealing their tires and racing to the next stop sign a block down the street. In fact, as I am typing this a blue mustang squealed out of this intersection and reached a high rate of speed followed by a black SUV doing the same.

In the past the Sheboygan Police Department was prudent enough to have a squad at this intersection from time to time. Of course, when faced with an SUV emblazoned with "Sheboygan Police Department" everyone is on their best behavior. Until, of course, the squad leaves.

I am asking that the City of Sheboygan look into either removing the stop signs or replacing them with traffic signals with the option of a "walk button". These lights could also go to flashing yellow when there is no school in session to keep the flow of traffic unfettered.
