



### Marketing and Sales

The 2022 Chicago boat show was once again postponed due to boat inventory. We are using Dockwa for our 2022 slip tenant agreements and the process is going well. Boaters receive email reminders on upcoming payments and have the ability to log into their account to edit payments and view their agreements. We currently have 150 slip tenants signed up for the season. More interest in A dock is coming in since we opened the North side of A dock. The store has remained open this winter and is doing well. The store is open in coordination with the bar for food service mostly. The current hours are Monday-Thursday 8am-5pm, Friday 8am-9pm and Saturdays 10am-7pm.

### **Maintenance and Operations**


We have a lot of projects going on. In the building we are painting and seeing what needs to updated. We are getting new counter tops in the bathrooms as well as the laundry room. The fuel dock repairs and upgrades have started. Advatech was here this week putting cameras inside and outside the fuel dock. Our next phase will be to install the new scribble software that will be integrated with the new dispensers. Since we opened the North side of A dock, we have had to order new dock boxes as well as rub rail. The docks are seeing a significate amount of damage. We had a conversation with Flotation Docking Systems, and they do not recommend repairing G dock but to instead replace it. The docks are pushing 30 years old so constant repairs are not going to be enough anymore. See pictures below:

#### Bar 43

Bar rental interest and traffic has increased. Currently the hours are Thursday-Sunday, we did drop Wednesdays after traffic evaluation. So far in 2022 we have 6 private rentals lined up, we did drop the rental price from \$800 to \$600 during business hours which seems to be more appealing during the wintertime. We will look to bump that price back up once the summer is here. The bar currently has a yearlong ad in The Sun. We have also seen messages come in with the ads we are currently running on social media. We are working on introducing "flights of beer" to our menu. We have ordered customized flight boards which should be here next week. We are also in conversation with Switchgear Brewing in Elkhart Lake to bring in their products as well as collaborating on some events such as beer tasting and parings.

# Parks & Forestry Report February 1, 2022 Report

The biggest focus in 2021 when talking about urban forestry here in Sheboygan was put on stump grinding. We had a three-year backlog of stumps to get caught up on and that was accomplished through the hard work of our tree crew and some additional support from hired contractors.

Here are last year's totals:


- 329 Ash Trees Removed
- 254 Non-Ash Trees Removed
- 749 Ash Trees Treated
- 1206 Trees Trimmed
- 583 Total Trees Removed
- 1360 Stumps Ground
- 467 Trees Planted



In 2022 our main focus will be on planting and pruning. We still have plenty of trees that will be removed and stumps that will be ground out but our goal this year is to plant more than we remove and prioritize pruning as much as possible.



Just like last year we will be planting bare-root trees, this allows for much lower price and dramatically easier and faster planting process. The plan is to plant 300 trees in the spring and 370 trees in the Fall. The majority of these trees will be planted along city streets with several being placed in park areas. If a resident would like a tree planted in the right of way adjacent to their property they can request one on the DPW website.



Through a \$25,000 grant from Sheboygan County Stewardship and Restoration Of Our Trees Sheboygan, we have constructed a Tree Gravel Bed in the previous police impound yard directly north of the DPW service building. This gravel bed will be used to accelerate the root growth of new trees during the summer months to greatly enhance the survivability and planting success. In 2022 this will house 370 trees that will be planted in fall.

Currently there are about 16,000 street trees within the City of Sheboygan. To achieve an eight-year pruning cycle, 2,000 trees need to be pruned every year. This hasn't happened in recent years due to the added burden of dying ash trees. Our goal is to hit this mark in 2022. The most important trees to prune are young trees, to train them to have good structure. This is called training pruning and is scheduled to happen 3 years after the trees are planted, then again at 6 years and 10 years. In 2022 there are 528 trees that need training pruning (of which 176 are completed already).







# Parks & Forestry Report February 1, 2022

It was great to get back to a normal year for park shelter rentals. The number of rentals also shows that the residents of Sheboygan were also ready to get back to holding gatherings. The department received 864 reservation permits totaling \$147,810 in sales for the City. The DPW front office does a great job working with the residents to find a shelter and a date that will work for their gathering. The parks department cleans up after each permit so the area is ready for the next rental.

- Below are pictures of the Cleveland Park Shelter and General King Park Pavilion.
- There are 10 open picnic shelters, two enclosed pavilions, two picnic areas and a bandshell that can be rented between May 15 and September 30.
- There are four enclosed park pavilions that can be rented year-round.





- DPW also received \$18,999.21 in park equipment rentals in 2021. Compare this to 2020 when almost all celebrations were canceled, only \$905 was taken in for equipment rentals. It was nice to see that we were even up \$800 from 2019 in rentals.
- DPW front office works with non-profit, business, and private groups to not only find the space needed for their gathering, but also reserve park equipment that may be needed and get them in-touch with other city departments.
- During the winter months park staff will fix and paint all park equipment so the equipment is ready to go back into the parks in the summer or be used for rentals. Parks signs are also repaired and painted.


- ADA Infrastructure Improvements in the parks

Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan (CORP):

On Wednesday, January 26, 2022, the CORP Community Survey was launched. The City's CORP is updated every 5 year and is used for budgeting, maintenance and planning annual projects in the City's parks. The city is also eligible for county, state and federal grants with a current approved plan.

DPW is working with the city to advertise both the CORP plan and the City's Strategic plan. Please take time to fill out both surveys before February 28, 2022.

### Fat biking:

A fatbike is an off-road bicycle with oversized tires that allows riding on soft unstable terrain such as snow, sand and mud. They have become increasingly popular over the past few years and fat bikers are riding in Evergreen and Jaycee Park year-round.
