# **BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS:**

Quarterly Benchmarks from the Fire Department for the period commencing October 1, 2021 and ending December 31, 2021 is presented for information and discussion as required by section 50-564 of the Municipal Code.

### **STAFF COMMENTS:**

Highlights of the Fourth Quarter of 2021 are as follows:

- Fire calls increased by 50% compared to fourth quarter last year.
- The SFD ran 512 more emergency medical calls compared to the previous year total.
- Total call volume increased by 11% compared to 2020.
- The SFD conducted 88 more inspections in 2021 than in 2020.
- Crews found 21 non-compliant occupancies without appropriate working smoke detectors.
- · Crews installed 17 smoke detectors.

# **BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS:**

The City of Sheboygan is eligible for funding to support the Sheboygan County Multi-Jurisdictional Enforcement Group through the JAG Drug Task Force Grant Solicitation for calendar year 2022 operations. The City of Sheboygan is eligible to receive funding in the amount of \$24,112 that consists of Federal Justice Assistance Grant funds and state penalty assessment fees. The State penalty assessment funds are State Matching funds and there are no local matching funds required. Funding is aimed at enhancing interagency coordination and intelligence sharing targeting gangs, drugs firearms and associated criminal investigations.

# **STAFF COMMENTS:**

The City of Sheboygan has been the lead agency of the Sheboygan County Multi-Jurisdictional Enforcement Group (MEG Unit) for more than 20 years. The JAG funding is the primary source of outside funding to support this multi-agency effort.

# **BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS:**

The Quarterly Report of Benchmarks for the Police Department for the Period commencing October 1, 2021 and ending December 31, 2021 is presented for information and discussion as required by section 54-65 of the Municipal Code.

# **STAFF COMMENTS:**

Highlights of the report are as follows:

- Part 1 Crime: There was an increase in violent crime year to date in comparison to the same period in 2020 and 2019 (157 vs.143 and 156) and a decrease in property crime in comparison to 2020 and 2019 (563 vs. 689 vs. 678). The increase in violent crime is related to the increase in rapes reported in 2021 in comparison to the same period in 2020 and 2019 (39 vs. 20 vs. 31).
- There was an increase in Traffic accidents year to date (1,365 vs. 1,340) in comparison to 2020, but a decrease from 1,592 in 2019. The comparison to 2020 is directly impacted by COVID conditions.
- There was an increase in involuntary commitments year to date in comparison to the same period in 2020 and 2019 (144 vs. 101 and 110).
